#### **GROWING UP IS HARD!**

Being a teenager is an exciting and scary transitional time in everyone's life. It's normal to sometimes feel alone or lost. Imagine growing up and lacking the tools or support to find your way. The Armory Youth Project (AYP) is here to help!

The Citizen's Research Council reports that youth in Michigan are facing increasing behavioral health challenges. Untreated behavioral health conditions diminish opportunities for academic, social, and occupational success. There are evidence-based strategies that foster resilience, including removing barriers, building up social support systems, and providing life skills.

The Armory Youth Project provides FREE year-round recreation and evidence-based educational opportunities for youth in grades 6-12. AYP is a safe place for youth to have fun, get help with homework, talk to a caring adult, learn life skills, and build self-confidence. The drop-in programming teaches youth independence and choice. AYP collaborates with community partners to provide a wide range of youth resources, including basic needs, health counseling, and emergency care.

At AYP we are fortunate to serve kids from all walks of life. Many kids come to AYP for socialization, to learn about God's love, and to meet new friends. While others attend AYP for a meal, a safe place to grow, and a mentor they can trust.

The Armory Youth Project strives to provide the tools and support for all youth to feel valued and realize a more promising future.

The Armory Youth Project 2024 annual operational budget of \$354,991 includes all administration, programming, facility, personnel (program team), and supply costs.

The program operates a 20,000 square feet building on four acres. The facility includes a full-size gym, multiple classrooms, a commercial kitchen, stage, open bay recreation room, outdoor basketball court, disc golf course, and a garden. The facility is open for community rental outside of youth programming hours.

As we work to keep the facility safe and secure for our students, we want to give a special thank you to our friends at the Manistee County Community Foundation for a recent grant award of \$61,588. The grant supported by the Minger Family Endowment Fund will help us provide a plumbing capital improvement project. The project implementation will take place in 2025.

The Armory Youth Project is funded by community donations, sponsorships, grants and community events.

Year to date AYP has raised \$311,000 through individual and corporate donations, business sponsorships, local and state grants, newsletter promotions, the Manistee Arts & Crafts show, facility rental, and the annual Showcase Breakfast.
